## Copa Multicultural Rules

## Eligibility

Student participants in the Copa Multicultural must be currently enrolled and attending an approved High School Program in the State of Oregon. A student body card from every player and a team roster will be requested by the referee at the beginning of each game. A copy of a roster will also be requested by the Copa Multicultural President before the beginning of the Tournament. A student who does not have his or her ID card for the current academy year WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PLAY, even if his or her name appears on the roster. Each participating school MUST have an adult Coach present at each match that knows all the players of that particular school.

Any student who has transferred to another school at any time during the year may continue to play on their original team. However, this student may not play against his or her current home school.

In addition, a team may include a guest player attending an Oregon State approved High School program not participating in the tournament. Limit 3 players for boy's divisions and 4 players* for girl's divisions ....no exceptions!!

Each team that registers with the Copa Multicultural must commit to finishing the season, regardless of the outcome.

If a team fails to abide by these regulations, the game will result in a forfeit.

Coaches are responsible for making sure their teams demonstrate appropriate sportsmanship behavior at all times. Soccer Uniforms are mandatory! Uniforms must have numbers and comparable colors.

Copa Multicultural will not allow a player without the proper uniform on the field.
Coaches will also be responsible for keeping track of yellow cards presented to students during the game.

## Scoring System

- Each win will be awarded a total of 3 points
- Each tie will be awarded a total of 1 point
- Loss games will not be awarded any points


## Playoffs

- The top 4 teams of each group that accumulate the highest amount of points will go to the Semifinals ( 1 vs $4-2$ vs 3 ) winners will advance to the Finals. Finalists will meet at the Championship on Saturday June $3^{\text {rd }}, 2023$.
- In case that more than two teams tie in the number of points, the goal average will be the tiebreaker
- If necessary, penalty kicks will decide the winner after 80 minutes of regular playing time, and 20 minutes of overtime. Golden Goal will only apply during the Semifinals games.
- During the Championship Game, Golden Goal WILL NOT APPLY. Overtime must be played in its entirety


## Rules

- All coaches must present a final roster of their players before March 31st 2023.
- A maximum of $\mathbf{2 2}$ players in each roster
- Boys Games will be $\mathbf{4 0}$ minutes each half. Girls games will be $\mathbf{4 0}$ minutes each half. Games will be scheduled on Saturdays and Sundays. A total of 5 Games for each team.
- All players must be currently attending an Oregon State approved High School program; Student ID Card required
- A yellow card given to any player will accumulate for the next game and a red card will result in the suspension of the student for the current game as well as for the next scheduled game. TWO red cards will result in total expulsion from the Tournament

- Trophies and medals will be award for First, and Second place for all Divisions
- MVP price will be awarded for each Final
