2023-2024 Hillsboro Rush Super Cup Rules Grades 3-8

The Hillsboro Rush Super Cup is open to any grassroots/developmental team in Oregon.

The tournament is intended for recreational level teams who want to play in an end of the Fall season tournament after league play has concluded.

Hillsboro Rush has NO TOLERANCE for any form of harassment, intimidation, abuse, assault, or racism.

Consumption or possession of alcohol, tobacco, nicotine, and marijuana products are strictly prohibited at all Hillsboro School District and Hillsboro Parks & Rec matches and facilities.

NO REFUND POLICY - There will be no refunds upon receipt of approval into the tournament. This policy is enforced because there are those few teams that withdraw without just cause before, during and after the schedules we post. The 1% of applicants withdrawing, this way, cause the responsible 99% scheduled tremendous grief due to multiple schedule changes.

This tournament is intended for grassroots, recreational level players. Players with a competitive OYSA card may not be included in the roster for the team registration. **Fielding a competitive player who has a competitive card is grounds for game/tournament forfeit.**

PLAYER & COACHES CONDUCT

1. All players and coaches will be expected to demonstrate good sportsmanlike conduct.

2. Any player or coach given a red card that is upheld, will not be able to participate in at least the following tournament game. A stiffer penalty may be imposed for extreme violations (such as violent conduct) at the Tournament Director's discretion.

3. Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their players, substitutes and spectators.

4. All referee decisions are final. THERE WILL BE NO APPEALS, ARBITRATION OR RECOURSE.

5. If, in the opinion of game officials, a game must be terminated for misconduct of players, substitutes, coaches or spectators, the offending team could be suspended from further play, forfeiting that game and all remaining games. All previously played games would be re-entered as forfeits, with points awarded accordingly. Additionally, the offending team's home league and state association will be contacted, as appropriate.

SPECTATOR CONDUCT

1. Inappropriate conduct by your team's spectators can jeopardize your coach and/or team.

2. At no time is there to be any alcoholic beverages at the tournament site. Violators will be prosecuted.

3. Pets are NOT allowed – at any field location!!

4. After each game, please pick up the trash on your sideline and place it in one of the provided receptacles.

5. Please help us keep on time by immediately collecting your things and clearing your sideline after your game. This will allow the next team to move into position and prepare for the start of their game.

1) Length of Matches and Ball Size

2) Point System

a) Wins/Losses/Tie

- A win is awarded with 3 points to the overall team standings
- A tie is awarded with 1 point to the overall team standings
- A loss is 0 points to the overall team standings.
- 1 goal is worth 1 point to the overall team standings (this only works for up to 3 goals maximum). This means a team can accumulate an extra three points to their standings if they score 3 goals.
- 1 point is awarded to teams and their overall standings that keep a clean sheet (no goals conceded during the individual game).
- Ultimately, teams can earn a total of 7 points with a win, 3 goals scored, and a clean sheet without conceding any goals during matchplay.

Bracket WINNERS

Winners of bracket play will be selected on the basis of the most total points after pool play is complete. (Pool play is defined by the three games scheduled. There is no final).

Scoring will be on a 7 point system.

A forfeit will be scored as a 1-0 win with five (5) points awarded. 3 for the win, 1 for a clean sheet, and 1 goal is considered scored.

TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

In the event that two or more teams tie for the most points in pool play, the following criteria shall be applied in the order listed until the tie is broken:

1. Head to head competition.

2. Goal differential (Goals FOR minus Goals AGAINST) (Max Diff or 3 per game).

- 3. Fewest goals allowed
- 4. Goals scored, up to 3 per game.

3) Substitutions

(a) Unlimited substitutions are permitted, with the consent of the referee, on any dead ball.

(b) Substituted players must leave the field of play at the half line near their team bench.

4) Stoppage Time

There will be no stoppage time for injuries.

5) Game Schedule

If the games start late the tournament director will make a decision on the length of the game to keep on time. If they do start late for any reason the game will end no more than five minutes after the scheduled time.

6. Games ending in a Draw (Tiebreakers)

a. Pool Play Games - there will be no tiebreaker exercised. There are no penalty kicks taken at the end.

Modified Rules - 3rd & 4th

Number of Players: 7 x 7

Roster Size: Recommended 10-12 players

Game Duration: 3rd & 4th grade two 20 minute halves

Ball Size: 4

Goalkeeper: yes

Field Size: 35 - 45 yards 50 - 60 yards 6 1/2 x 18 1/2 Goal Size: 6 yards wide by 6.5 feet high must be anchored

Goal Area: as marked on the field Penalty Area: yes

Fouls Punished: by indirect kick only for 3rd grade, direct and indirect for 4th grade

Off-sides: "mild enforcement" (referee may warn players first). Offside is enforced using the BOL

Penalty Kicks: Taken at the painted penalty spot

Drop Kicks/Punts: no

Headers: no

Throw-ins: no re-throws

Additional Notes:

1. GOAL KICK or when the keeper has possession of the ball - The rule is designed to promote escalated player development via more meaningful player touches in matches. It is also intended to reduce goals from an immediate turn over in this area.

 Opposing players (defenders) must remain on their half of the Build Out Line (BOL) until the goalkeeper has passed the ball AND the receiving player has touched the ball.

 $\circ\,$ If an opposing player crosses the BOL before the receiving player touches the ball the goal kick will be retaken.

 \circ If the ball goes past the BOL after the goalie passes it, the ball is in play and may be played by anyone. The offensive team has lost their privilege to play the ball first.

2. Spectators should be a minimum of 4 yds off the sidelines.

3. On all free kicks, opponents must be 10 yards from the ball.

4. No free kicks shall be taken by the attacking team within the defending team's goal box. If there would have been a penalty in the goal area, the indirect freekick will be taken outside the goal area at the point nearest to where the foul occurred.

5. Coaches, parents or spectators etc. are not allowed to be within 18 yards of the goal line or behind the goal.

6. Coaches and teams on one side of field, parents and spectators on other

7. Maximum of 3 coaches per team on the sideline and all coaches must be registered with OYSA.

Modified Rules - 5th & 6th

Number of Players: 9 x 9

Roster Size: Recommended 12-15 players

Game Duration: 5th & 6th two 25 minute halves

Ball Size: 5th & 6th size 4

Goalkeeper: yes

Field Size: 45 - 55 yards 70 - 80 yards $6 \frac{1}{2} \times 18 \frac{1}{2}$ Goal Size: 6 yards wide by 6.5 feet high, where 18' goals are not available, 24' are used.

Fouls: punished by direct or indirect free kick

Off-side: enforced

Penalty Kicks: enforced

Throw-ins: no re-throws

Drop kicks/punts: Yes

Headers: No

Additional Notes

1. Spectators should be a minimum of 4 yds off the sidelines.

2. Coaches, parents or spectators etc. are not allowed to be within 18 yards

of the goal line or behind the goal.

3. Coaches and teams on one side of the field, parents and spectators on the other.

4. Maximum of 3 coaches per team on the sideline and all coaches must be registered with OYSA.

5. No Headers for Kinder through 6th grade. As part of the US Soccer Initiative, it is recommended that players 10 years old and younger be

prohibited from heading the ball in practice and games. If a player deliberately heads the ball in

a game, an indirect free kick (IFK) should be awarded to the opposing team from the spot of the offense. If the deliberate header occurs within the goal area, the indirect free kick shall be taken on the goal area line parallel to the goal line at the point nearest to where the header occurred. If a player does not deliberately head the ball, then play shall continue.

Modified Rules - 7th/8th grade

Number of Players: 11 x 11

Roster Size: Recommended 15-18 players

Game Duration: 7th/8th grade 25 minute halves

Ball Size: 7th/8th grade size 5

Goalkeeper: yes

Field Size: 100 to 120 by 55 to 75 yards

Goal Size: 8 yards wide by 8 feet high, must be anchored

Penalty Area: 18 yds wide from goal post and 18 yds deep from goal line

Goal Area: 6 yds wide from the goal post and 6 yds deep from the goal line

Fouls: punished by direct or indirect free kick

Off-sides: enforced

Penalty Kicks: enforced

Throw-ins: no re-throws

Drops Kicks/ Punts:Yes

Headers: Yes
