



Team Composition:

a. Each team must have a minimum of 7 players and a maximum of 15 players on their roster.

b. The field ratio of male and female players has to be equal for Coed 7v7. Goalie does not count; the goalie could be either male or female.

c. If a team cannot field the minimum required number of female players due to injuries or other valid reasons, they may play with fewer players but will be disadvantaged.

Game Format:

a. The game consists of two 25-minute halves with a brief halftime interval (typically 5 minutes).

- b. Teams change ends at halftime.
- c. Offsides will not be enforced.

d. In the event of a tie at the end of regulation time, the game will result in a draw.

e. Men are not allowed to chip, pass, or shoot the ball in the air when within 3 yards of a female player. Violations result in an indirect free kick for the opposing team. (Halo Rule)

Substitutions:

a. Substitutions are "on the fly," which means players can enter or exit the field at any time, provided they do so from the designated substitution area on their team's sideline.

Points System

- a. Match Points:
 - Win: 6 points
 - Tie: 3 points
 - Loss: 0 points
- b. Additional Points: Shoutout (no goals conceded): 1 point
- c. Standings: Points earned throughout the tournament determine team standing.
- d. Tiebreakers (in order):
 - Least goals conceded
 - Most goals scored
 - Penalty shootout

e. Male and female goals count for one goal. Male players are limited to 3 goals a game in Coed 7v7.

Team Advancement:

a. The tournament will be divided into divisions: Div 1 and Div 2



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b. Teams will compete against each other within their respective divisions.

c. At the end of the round-robin stage in each division, the team with the highest points in their division will win.

d. In the event of a tie in points within a division, see Tiebreaker in the Points System section.

e. The final will feature Division I Advanced and Division II Recreational winners, who will compete for the tournament championship.

Award ceremony immediately following the final game.

Player Conduct:

a. Players must conduct themselves in a respectful and sportsmanlike manner throughout the tournament.

b. Unsportsmanlike behavior, including verbal abuse, physical aggression, or dangerous play, may result in penalties or ejection from the game at the referee's discretion.

c. Players who receive a red card will be suspended for the next game.

d. Any player or team found to violate the rules or engaging in unsportsmanlike conduct may face further disciplinary action, including disqualification from the tournament.

Referee Decisions:

a. The decisions made by the referee are final and must be respected by all players and team officials.

b. Disputes or concerns regarding specific decisions may be raised with the referee during halftime or after the game, but not during gameplay.

Safety:

a. Safety is of the utmost importance. Players are expected to play the game safely, avoiding reckless tackles or actions that may harm themselves or others.

b. Players should wear appropriate equipment, including shin guards, to protect themselves during the game.

c. Any injuries sustained during the game should be immediately reported to the referee, and appropriate medical attention should be sought.
